- b) A, by shooting at a fowl (bird) with intent to kill and steal it, kills B who was behind a bush, not knowing that he was there. Whether A has committed offence of culpable homicide? Give reasons.
- c) A is in a house which is on fire, with a child Z. People below hold out a blanket. A drops the child from the housetop, knowing it to be likely that the fall may kill the child. The child is killed by the fall. Discuss the liability of A.
- d) A shakes his fist at Z, intending or knowing it to be likely that he may thereby cause Z to believe that A is about to strike Z. Whether A has committed an offence?
- e) A and B, being joint owners of a horse, A takes the horse out of B's possession, intending to use it. But, thereafter, A sells the horse and appropriates the whole proceeds to his own use. What offence A has committed? Explain.
